# Strengthening information management capabilities

# **Belize Crime Observatory**

→ Is Belize's national repository for crime data and information. The BCO collects and processes information from multiple sources for use in multidimensional security analyses, patterns, and criminal tendencies. Its work informs policy and decision making on citizen security incorporating innovative digital tools.



# Periodic analysis (quarterly and annual) of Citizen Security

Including major crimes, murder rate, monthly and annual major crimes statistics other special reports include Domestic Violence Amid Covid-19 Report, Citizen Security Analysis June 2021, Mid-year Crime Analysis Report 2021.

# Inter-Agency Group on Crime and Violence

Regular inter-agency sessions are held to share and consolidate data and information on deaths caused by road-traffic accidents, suicides, and homicides from administrative data, which inform action plans and public policies.

# Joint work has made it possible to produce technological tools to move forward with a new vision of public policy



TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENT FOR AUTOMATED INFORMATION ANALYSIS

Two information management tools have been developed: "Advanced Analyzer" and "Situational Analysis". Both make it possible for the integration of databases from multiple sources and have been developed to automate citizen security analyses with disaggregation by sex and age.

Innovative and multidimensional platform, to advance more structured framework for interagency collaboration for data sharing, analysis, reporting and capacity-building. The support for the IIMP has been developed trough:

- Strengthening the GeoSpatial Working Group of Defense and Intelligence Analysts.
- Focused trainings offered to the Belize Crime Observatory (BCO) and partners included Data Analysis for Policy Formulation, Geographic Information System, Gender-Perspective in Information Management, Predictive Analytics and Use of InfoGraphics Design, Advanced Data Analysis, use of IIMP.

SUPPORT FOR EVIDENCE-BASED PUBLIC POLICY AND PLANNING: Formulation of "National Capacity Development Plan for the Justice Sector of Belize"

Two-year Advocacy Strategy and Plan were developed for the Belize Crime Observatory and interagency partners to focus on three thematic areas: violence against women and girls, urban violence, and youth-involved crimes.

- The solution to the problem of violence against women and girls is prevention and combating the issue
- "Belize #StaySafe" campaign on violence against women was carried out in 2021 in conjunction with the 16 Days of Activism
- Belize has since strategically planned and expanded advocacy campaigns to include urban violence and youth
