INSIGHTS ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS

- In Belize, women and girls continue to be the main victims of both Domestic and Sexual Violence.
- Intimate partner violence continues to be a main arising concern within the continuum of violence.
- A significant percentage of victims of Domestic Violence constitute of at least one type of abuse such as physical, psychological, verbal, or financial.
- Majority of the victims of Sexual Violence are girls of ages less than 20 years.
- The predominant weapon used in both male and female murders was a firearm. However, female murders committed with a sharp object were twice as much than that of male murders.
- In Belize, Violence Against Women and Girls prove to be of concern hence, the Domestic Violence in Belize Motion of Parliament was launched to prioritize Domestic Violence as a national issue of significance. This bill sets out specific measures and commitments that the government is taking against this national issue.

What is Violence Against Women and Girls?


Violence Against Women and Girls is understood to be "any action or conduct, based on gender, that causes death, harm or physical, sexual, or psychological suffering to women, both in the public and private spheres."

Why is it necessary to generate robust information on Violence Against Women and Girls?

1.

It is the result of a system that is based on **unequal power relations** between the sexes.

2.

Exposure to a series of **specific risks** coupled with other forms of **discrimination and social exclusion** to generate high and multiple vulnerability.

3.

It is urgent to develop **gender-sensitive indicators** that make it possible to characterize this reality and design effective **public policies.**


How is the continuum of violence against women and girls manifested?

Domestic Violence

Domestic Violence in Belize Law refers to "...physical, sexual, emotional, psychological, or financial abuse committed by a person against a spouse, child, de facto spouse, or any other person who is a member of the household of the applicant or the respondent."

Domestic Violence Act, 2007 (Belize)

- During 2022, women and girls were the main victims of Domestic Violence accounting for 79% of the reports.
- 76% of all reports were filed by women aged 20 to 44 years.




Domestic Violence by Age and Sex, 2022

• In 2022, **95%** of the Domestic Violence reports occurred **in the residence** of either the victim or the perpetrator.




- 8 in 10 Domestic Violence reports were levied against a present or past intimate partner.
- 2 in 10 Domestic Violence reports were levied against a family member.

Note: Family member includes any individual in the household that has direct or familial contact with the accuser.




Sexual violence

"Sexual violence is any act, attempted or threatened, that is sexual in nature and carried out without the consent of the victim. Sexual violence includes rape, sexual abuse and harassment, exploitation, and forced prostitution. It can happen within marriages, especially when there is a lack of consent for sexual activity by one of the spouses."


- Cases of sexual violence in major crimes category increased in 2022.
- Sexual Violence cases accounted for 8% in the major crimes category.



Sexual Violence Cases, 2017 to 2022

Note: Major Crimes in Belize includes Murder, Rape, Robbery, Burglary, Theft and Unlawful Sexual Intercourse.

- During 2022, 99% of the victims of sexual violence were females.
- 73% of all victims of sexual violence were females aged 10 to 19 years.

Femicide/Feminicide

Femicide is generally understood to involve intentional murder of women, but broader definitions include any killing of women or girls.

Femicide differs from male homicide in specific ways. For example, most cases of femicide are committed by partners or ex-partners, and involve ongoing abuse in the home, threats or intimidation, sexual violence, or situations where women have less power or fewer resources than their partner.

 Females accounted for 8% of the murder victims in 2022.






Murder Victims by Sex, 2022

Understanding and addressing violence against women, WHO (2012)

Note: Femicides is not legally defined in Belize but instead it is characterized based on international standard definition.

- In 2022, 22% of the females who were murdered were victims of gender-related murders or femicides.
- 2 in 10 of the females were murdered by an intimate partner.
- 6 in 10 of the females were murdered with a firearm.
- 3 in 10 of the females were murdered with a sharp object.
- 1 in 10 of the females were murdered by other weapons.



Note: 8 in 10 of the males were murdered with a firearm.
